

More good news after the repatriation of a cured French patient:

three more LAR missions to the Grand Est!

On request of the French health authorities, Luxembourg Air Rescue is now actively flying missions to repatriate COVID-19 patients from the Grand Est region.

This was indeed the case again yesterday, with one of the LAR helicopters involved in this vast cross-border cooperation flying between the Northern Hospital Centre, in Ettelbruck, and the city of Colmar in order to reunite a cured patient with his relatives. At the same time, another repatriation was undertaken from Austria to France, by using one of LAR's air ambulances.

Three additional LAR missions are also scheduled for today, two by air ambulances (Learjet 45XR) and a third one by MD902 helicopter.

The ambulance jets will both fly from Magdeburg, one to Metz, and the other to Saarbrücken, while the planned helicopter transfer will be between Mainz and Mulhouse.

The organization, with its subsidiary Luxembourg Air Ambulance (LAA) is made up of six MD902 helicopters and now six state-of-the art Learjet 45XR aircraft.
